Carmen Nasr WRITER

Carmen is a British-Lebanese playwright. Her most recent work, The Climbers premiered at Theatre by the Lake, Keswick, and The Maladies, made with the Almeida Theatre young company, premiered at The Yard Theatre.

In 2017, Carmen was a winner of the Channel 4 Playwrights' Scheme, on which she was attached to the Finborough Theatre, where her play *Dubailand* premiered. In 2015 her play *The House of my Father* was long-listed for the Bruntwood Prize.

Sepy Baghaei is an Iranian-Australian theatre director based in London. She originally trained as an actor at the Australian Academy of Dramatic Art, before moving to London to complete an MA in Advanced Theatre Practice

at the Royal Central School of Speech and Drama. She has also trained on the National Theatre Directors Course. Sepy is primarily drawn to new writing, and has workshopped new plays with the National Theatre Studio
