





Ivo Graham WRITER & PERFORMER

Despite extensive grooming for more serious careers at Eton and Oxford. Ivo (now 34) has spent his entire adult life on the stand-up circuit, winning So You Think You're Funny? aged 18 in 2009 and since establishing himself as, if not the UK's poshest, then certainly its most apologetically posh comedian. He's appeared on TV comedies including Have I Got News for You, QI, The Last Leq, Mock the Week, and Live at the Apollo, guizzed with varying degrees of success on Pointless, House of Games, Mastermind, and University Challenge, and toured the country with Fern Brady and Darren Harriott for Dave's six-part travelogue British as Folk in 2021. He's earned his parents' respect with appearances on Radio 4's The Now Show, The News Quiz, Just a Minute, and the drama Unite, and his forthcoming panel show Ivo Graham's Obsessions, and shoehorned Swindon Town references into many an episode of 5 Live's Fighting Talk and BT Sport's The Football's On. In 2023 Ivo competed, energetically if not not successfully, on the fifteenth series of Channel 4's Taskmaster, making bold and

arguably greedy intrusions into the world of theatre and clubnight producing.

In 2024, this shambolic triple threat returned to the Fringe with *Grand Designs* (you'll laugh), *Carousel* (you'll cry), and *Comedians' DJ Battles* (you'll have the best night out of your year), as well as recounting these and other adventures/ calamities in his first book, *Yardsticks For Failure*, set to be published by Headline in May 2025.

Matt is a theatre director who has worked on shows across London and the West End as well as in regional venues and drama schools, predominantly staging new plays and musicals.

Credits as a director include: Carousel (Park Theatre/Edinburgh Fringe); The Jungle Book (Chichester Festival Theatre); Piano Play (The Other Palace/Edinburgh Fringe/Tour); What Was Left (Southwark Playhouse); Mixtape, The Factory and We Were Told There Was Dancing (all for the Royal Exchange Theatre) and The Ballad of Rudy (Cornerstone Theatre/Tour).

As associate director credits include: Here & Now (Alexandra Theatre); The Odyssey (National Theatre); 2:22 - A Ghost Story (West End); Witness for the Prosecution (County Hall); Queens of the Coal Age (Royal Exchange Theatre and New Vic Theatre) and Nothing and Brink (Royal Exchange Theatre).

He has taught in drama schools including LAMDA and Mountview, is a trustee of Told By An Idiot, a Mentor Director for National Theatre Connections, was a Resident Director at the Almeida Theatre and the Young Company Director at the Royal Exchange Theatre from 2014 - 2018, seeing the company win School of the Year at The Stage Awards in 2018.

The building opened in May 2013 and, with 10 West End transfers (including **Rose** starring **Maureen Lipman**, *The Boys in the Band* starring **Mark Gatiss** and **Pressure** starring **David Haig**), two National Theatre transfers and 14 national tours in its first 12 years, quickly garnered a reputation as a key player in the London theatrical scene. Park Theatre has received seven Olivier nominations, won numerous Off West End Offie Awards, and won The Stage's Fringe Theatre of the Year and Accessible Theatre Award.
