James McDermott

James McDermott's plays published by Samuel French include *Jab* (Finborough Theatre/Park Theatre; Offie nominated for Best New Play 2024), *Time and Tide* (Park Theatre/Tour; Offie nominated for Best New Play 2020; longlisted for the Bruntwood Playwriting Prize) and *Rubber Ring* (Pleasance Islington/Tour; winner of Pulse Festival's Suitcase Prize 2017).

Other plays include More Ghost Stories By Candlelight (HighTide; Sam Wanamaker Playhouse/East of England tour), Acid's Reign (VAULT Festival) and Robin Good: The Politico-Panto (Norwich Playhouse).

James's poetry collections include **Wild Life** (Nine Arches Press; shortlisted for the East Anglian Book Award 2023), **Erased** (Polari Press) and **Manatomy** (Burning Eye Books; longlisted for the Polari First Book Prize 2021).

James is also one of the writers on BBC soap opera *EastEnders* and lectures in creative writing at the University of East Anglia.

Scott Le Crass

Scott was born in Bristol, grew up in Birmingham, trained as an actor at Arts Ed. He was a director on the Birmingham Rep's first Foundry Programme and in 2022 completed the National Theatre Director's Course. He is an Associate Director for Pleasure Dome Theatre Company and has directed all of their productions to date including A Christmas Carol (Brewhouse, Taunton), Louisa (South West Tour), A Midsummer Night's Dream (The Valley of Rocks). Scott directed the Off Com award winning digital revival of Rose by Martin Sherman starring Maureen Lipman (Hope Mill Theatre/Sky Arts/Broadway HD). Last year he was nominated for Best Creative West End Debut at The Stage Awards for his production of Rose. This year, he was Creative Associate for the 1st Thurrock Pride Festival.

After a twenty-year career in technology research and consulting, Kevin became a full-time theatre producer in 2022. Prior to this, he served as Associate Producer on several productions including Offie-Award Winning Country Music by Simon Stephens (Omnibus Theatre, 2019). Kevin's first solo production, **Buff** by Ben Fensome (Pleasance, July 2023), achieved outstanding critical and commercial success at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, winning a Playbill 'Pick of the Fringe' award. MANikin by Nathan Scott-Dunn, co-produced with Saltire Sky Theatre, won Best Drama at the Edinburgh Fringe Derek Awards 2024. Kevin has also served as Production Manager on award-nominated shows including Jab by James McDermott (Finborough Theatre, March 2024) and Wormholes by Emily Jupp (Omnibus Theatre, August 2024).

Adam Langston COMPOSER & SOUND DESIGNER

Adam has been immersed in film and theatre music for the past two decades. He worked extensively with Oscar-winning director Tom Hooper and Bafta-winning editor Melanie Oliver on **Cats**, creating arrangements and additional music. Adam had the honour of orchestrating Billie Eilish's song 'No Time to Die' for Hans Zimmer, which won the Oscar for Best Original Song. He has also been fortunate to work with Guy Chambers, including orchestrations for folk musical **The Selfish Giant** (Vaudeville Theatre), and for Robbie Williams' no.1 album The Christmas Present.

Compositions include: Miss Willoughby and the Haunted Bookshop (starring Kelsey Grammer); I'll Play Mother (Susanne Wuest); Splinter (Bill Fellows and Jane Asher); Mia and the Dragon Princess (Paul McGann); Goblin (Holliday Grainger); Night Feed (Alice Lowe).

Adam's animation work includes: orchestral arrangements and production for Oscar-nominated animated films *Robin Robin* (Aardman Animations) and *Revolting Rhymes* (Magic Light Pictures), Paramount Pictures' animated feature *The Little Prince* (directed by Mark Osborne), and *Frozen* arrangements for Walt Disney Resorts in Florida and Tokyo.



Adam enjoys writing music for charities, including Children in Need, the Special Olympics, and the Military Wives Choirs, whose album Remember features his song Carry Me.

Adam was awarded an Associateship of the Royal Academy of Music in 2019.
