Dave Florez

WRITER

Dave is a playwright and screenwriter, writing both comedy and drama. His Hampstead Theatre play *Experience* was runner-up in the Nick Darke Award; Dave then adapted it into the feature film *Embers*, which was part of a BFI London Film Festival showcase, before being nominated for Best UK Feature at Raindance Film Festival. Dave has had several plays at the Edinburgh Festival, including *Somewhere Beneath*, winner of a Fringe First Award. His short plays have been produced at Royal Court, Soho Theatre, and the Criterion, and his plays are published by Bloomsbury.

Dave is a BAFTA Connect Member, a BBC Voices alumnus, and his comedy **Shock Jock** aired on Radio 4. His TV sitcom and drama pilots have been optioned by Hat Trick, LA Productions and Doorway Films; and he has developed projects with Red Productions, Rollem and Tiger Aspect. His feature thriller **Sins in the Family** premiered on Lifetime/Paramount+.

Adam Meggido

DIRECTOR

Known as the 'King of Improvised Chaos' and a regular collaborator with Mischief Theatre, Adam Meggido is the director of worldwide smash-hits and Oliviernominated Peter Pan Goes Wrong (Broadway, UK Tour, Italy, New Zealand/Australia, West End, Latvia, Mexico) and Magic Goes Wrong (UK Tour, West End), and the cocreator and artistic director of Olivier award-winning Showstopper! The Improvised Musical. Showstopper has played in 12 countries worldwide, and continues a West End residency. Winning the 2016 Olivier for 'Best Entertainment and Comedy', it was the first improvised show to win a major theatre award. Adam also holds the world record for directing long form improvisation – 55 hours in Toronto (2013). He is currently writing on a show for HBO. Adam's current production Peter Pan Goes Wrong on Broadway has been nominated for 3 Drama Desk Awards (Outstanding Direction of a Play; Unique Theatrical Experience, Outstanding Costume Design), 3 Outer Critics Circle Awards (Outstanding New Broadway Play, Outstanding Director of a Play, Outstanding Scenic Design) and a Drama League Award for Outstanding Production. His book - Improv Beyond Rules: A Practical Guide to Narrative Improvisation is published by Nick Hern Books.

Sara has designed over 300 shows to date, for UK & world tours, regional theatres, immersive & site specific, West End and National Theatre; and for genres including Shakespeare, classic drama, devised work, family shows, new writing, comedy and musicals.

She was Head of Design for Shakespeare's Rose Theatre at York (managing teams for eight concurrent productions); and she specifically designed Macbeth, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Twelfth Night and Hamlet, as well as the theatre stage and facade (2018-19, York & Oxford).

She has held Resident Associate Designer positions at both The Mercury and English Touring Theatre, and was nominated for Broadway World Award and WhatsOnStage Award (American Idiot); for An Offie (Oranges & Elephants and Flowers For Mrs Harris). The latter was awarded Best Off West End Production by WhatsOnStage '23. She holds an Edinburgh Fringe First; The John Elvery Theatre Design Award, and a Vision Design (Costume) Award from the BBC.

She Holds a BA Hons in Drama & Theatre Studies; and trained in Theatre Design at Bristol Old Vic Theatre School.
