Since 2021, she has worked extensively in sound design for theatre in London, emphasising the spatial presentation of sound through hybrid systems that merge software, hardware, and visual for narrative elements purposes. Following research during her Sound Arts BA (2024), she describes her practice as "sonic cultural technology design," highlighting sound as a psycho-cultural tool for personal empowerment and community building when beyond the frame of music.
